1. GMI Readiness Framework

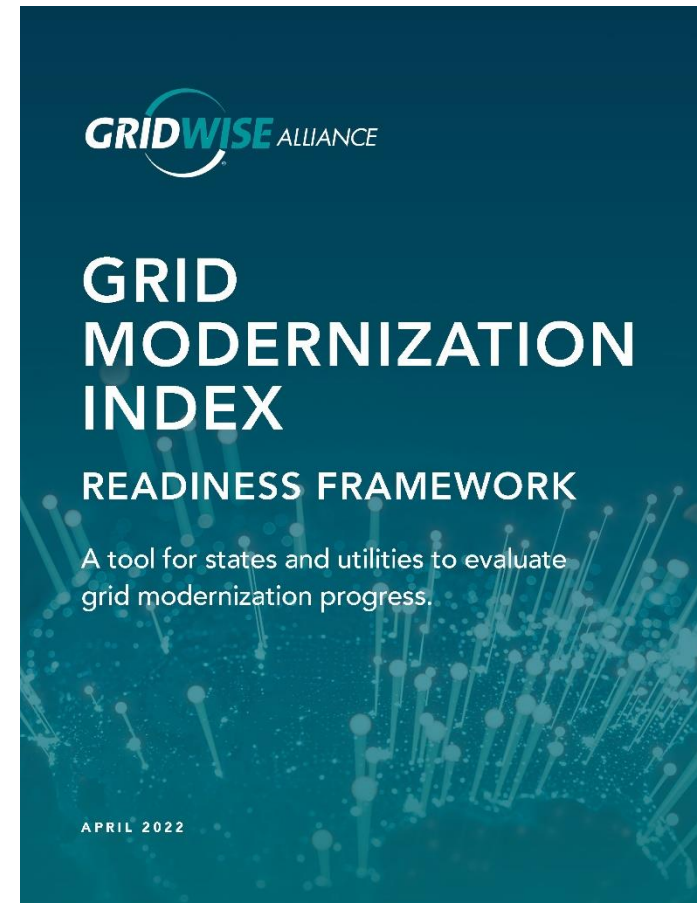

- Case studies collected across the Readiness Framework

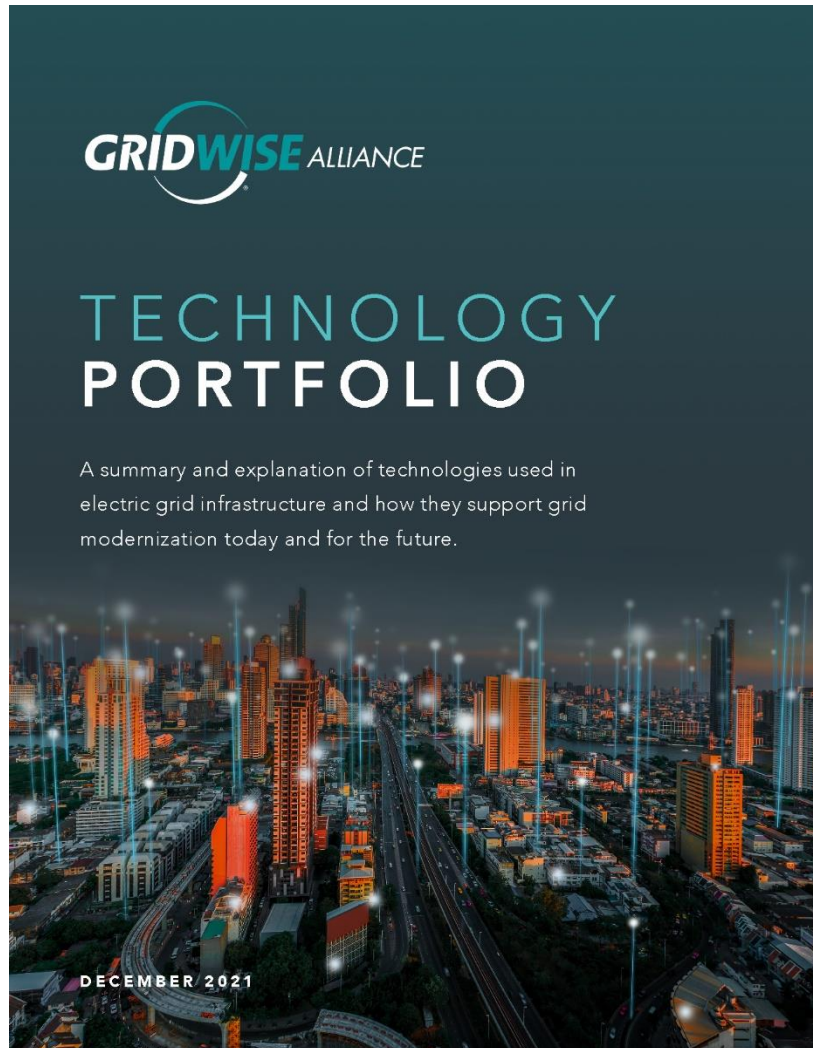
3. GMI Readiness Report

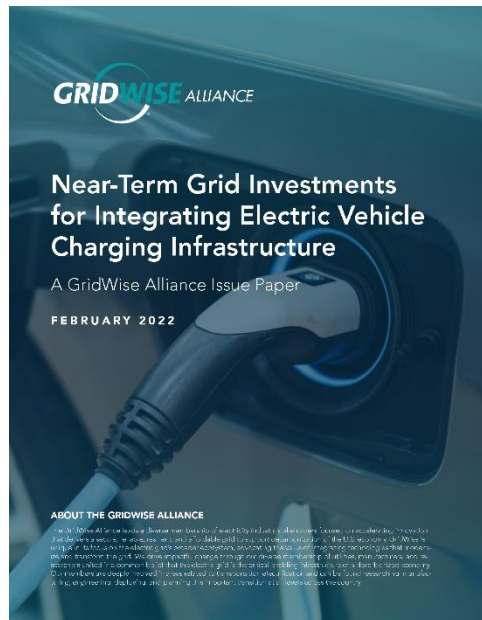

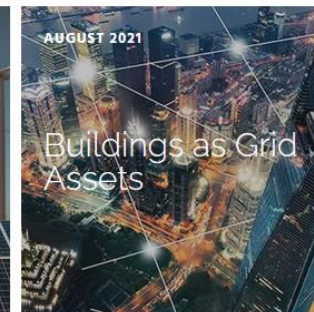
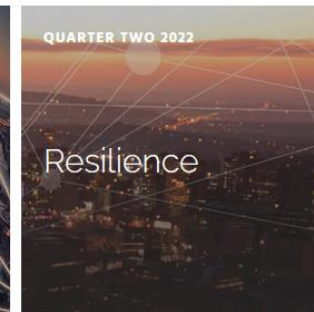
